Transnational Project Meeting in Aydin, Turkiye

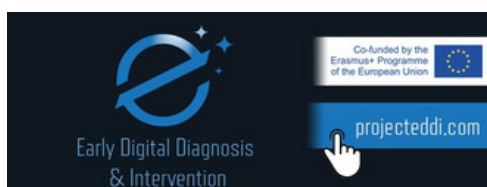
